Project Title: The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia: Technical Support for Enhancement of the Migrants Registration

Project duration: 4 months

Budget: EUR 99,777.71

Project status: Completed

Executive Summary:

Within this project, IOM supported the efforts of the Macedonian Ministry of Interior (MoI) in the improvement of the registration process in the established registration centers in Tabanovce and Gevgelija. The improvement of the registration process as well as the collection of biometric data has been foreseen and was required as per the priorities set at national and EU level. The equipment procured through this project will thus further help the MoI to continue aligning the current registration process with the requirements set by the Governments of the countries along the Western Balkan’s route, hence speed up the registration process for processing of new arrivals and enable collection of biometric data.

Project Title: Assisting Vulnerable Migrants in Serbia 2017

Project duration: 6 months

Budget: EUR 35,700

Project status: Ongoing

Executive Summary:

Caritas proposes to improve the nutrition and the hygienic situation of especially vulnerable refugees in reception centers in Sid municipality.

The main goal of the project is to reduce the vulnerability of refugees by providing humanitarian assistance through distribution of basic food and non-food items, such as:

- 1) Providing breakfasts for migrants who are placed in Šid
 - 2) Providing hygiene kits for women and hygienic packages for children / babies
 - 3) Providing clothing and shoes for winter conditions for the most vulnerable migrants, primarily for women and children / babies
 - 4) Providing washing powders to help migrants in washing clothes and bedding.

Project Title: Support to refugees in AC Tutin and AC Sjenica

Project duration: 6 months

Budget: EUR 49,515

Project status: Ongoing

Executive Summary:

Ana and Vlade Divac foundation are providing direct humanitarian, psychosocial and intercultural support to migrants and refugees in AC Tutin and AC Sjenica under this project.

Expected Project Results:

1. 500 refugees/migrants accommodated at AC Tutin and AC Sjenica received direct humanitarian assistance in NFI (clothing, boots, jackets, etc) and hygiene kits.
2. 5,000 items, i.e. NFI (clothing, boots, jackets etc.) and hygiene kits delivered to refugees according to their current needs
3. 40 workshops for children (boys/girls) accommodated in AC Tutin and AC Sjenica conducted by volunteers and local civil society activists
4. 40 psychosocial and intercultural workshops for women accommodated in AC Tutin and AC Sjenica organized and conducted by volunteers and local civil society activists
5. 20 volunteers and local CSOs participated in provision of support and assistance
6. Improved cooperation between local government and civil society organizations

Project Title: Strengthening Local Actors in Refugee Integration in Macedonia

Project duration: 9 months

Budget: EUR 43,095

Project status: Ongoing

Executive Summary:

Project proposal aims to increase the capacities and understanding of the local governmental administration about its obligations under the national refugee legislation and is comprehensively engaged in a constructive dialogue with the local CSOs towards accepting and integrating the refugees in the Macedonian society.

More specific objectives of the project is to:

- Asses the capacities of the local administration for implementation of the upcoming Strategy for Integration of Refugees and Foreigners;
- Empower local actors and increase capacities for responding to the needs of the refugee population;
- Capacity building for local CSOs for provision of services to refugees and raise awareness on local level.

The Group 484's financial and technical assistance for sub-granting process is part of the larger Norwegian Embassy-funded Grant Scheme Refugee Crisis Relief Fund

Project Title: Info Park

Project duration: 9 months

Budget: EUR 49,990

Project status: Ongoing

Executive Summary:

Trag foundation in cooperation with B92 proposes to facilitate safety, dignity, respect of human rights and empowerment to refugees currently located in Belgrade with a provision of services related to their protection, information sharing, communication facilitation and education.

The proposed activities are described as outdoor (immediate response/support – information sharing, identification of the most vulnerable groups, referrals, accommodation, transportation, collection and analyses of relevant data on the number of newcomers, pushbacks and returnees on daily basis), and indoor (providing key service information, transportation to the ACs and RAPs in coordination with KIRS, provide an ultimate security from GBV and sexual harassment, providing languages courses (English and German). Also, within this grant, Info Park plans to organize two integration events that will be held in spring and summer 2017, one of them marking the World Refugee Day (June 20th). These events are designed to contribute to integration of refugees into the local community through music, dancing, workshops for children, recreational sports and social games.
